## **CONDEMNATION**

The High Court Bar Association Larkano strongly condemns any attempt by members of the Qadiani (Ahmadiyya) community to carry out religious activities. Such actions constitute a clear violation of the constitutional and legal framework of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan.

Under Article 260(3)(b) of the Constitution of Pakistan, Qadianis are explicitly declared non-Muslims. Furthermore, Ordinance XX of 1984, particularly Sections 298-B and 298-C of the Pakistan Penal Code (PPC), prohibits Qadianis from using Islamic titles, performing Islamic rituals, or presenting themselves as Muslims in any manner. Any acts such as offering Eid prayers, performing animal sacrifices, or organizing public religious gatherings by the Qadiani community are considered criminal offences under these provisions, as well as under Sections 295 and 298 PPC, which aim to protect Islamic values and penalize offenses against religious sentiments.

This Bar Association calls upon law enforcement agencies to take immediate and effective action to prevent any activities by the Qadiani community that mimic Islamic practices. Such actions not only violate Pakistani law but also risk disturbing public order and deeply offending the religious sensitivities of the Muslim majority. The local administration must ensure full enforcement of Sections 298-B, 298-C, which specifically prohibit Qadianis from posing as Muslims, and take strict legal action against any violations including dispersal of unlawful assemblies and prosecution under the relevant penal code sections.

Moreover, the judiciary is urged to take suo motu notice of any breaches of these laws to safeguard the religious identity of Islam as enshrined in the Constitution. Both the federal and provincial governments must issue clear directives to all relevant authorities to ensure that any Qadiani-led activities that could mislead the public or incite sectarian discord are strictly prevented.

This Bar Association reiterates its unwavering belief that while the rights of all minorities must be respected, no group or community should be allowed to cross the constitutional and legal boundaries established to preserve the Islamic character of Pakistan.
